

Community and Environment



The recent Victorian bushfires were the worst natural disaster in Australian history. Over 200 people lost their lives and 7000 residents were displaced. Heron Resources responded by donating a large supply of goods to the victims through the Victorian Bushfire Appeal. Our donation was part of a massive Kalgoorlie-Boulder community appeal which saw seven shipping containers of goods shipped out to the bushfire affected communities in Victoria.

Heron Resources recently commenced support of the National Malleefowl Recovery Plan through sponsorship, engagement with and in-kind donations to Malleefowl NGO's and volunteers working on this endangered species. Heron's exploration personnel working in remote Mallee bush locations are reporting sightings of Malleefowl, their nest mounds and footprints as part of their daily work.

Heron is supporting large-scale surveys and research over many of its nickel tenements and project areas to enhance knowledge of the Malleefowl's distribution and natural history. The Company will host up to 20 volunteers and survey managers who will be undertaking the initial work over seven days in July at the Meningina Station. Heron believes proactive engagement with environmental interest groups is a positive way to foster working relationships - which will assist future Project approvals.

Heron is rehabilitating drill sites in compliance with tenement conditions set out by the Department of Mines and Petroleum.

All our drill holes are being capped, sumps filled in, plastic sample bags removed from site and the tracks ripped to allow natural regeneration of which the success is monitored over time.
