Rocky Gully



The Rocky Gully Project is located 70kms north west of Albany, in the Albany-Fraser Orogen. Heron has recently carried out further reconnaissance work in the area, following up on previous work in the area by previous explorers. This resulted in the expansion of the areas of interest surrounding last years drilling and the identification of an additional area of interest.

Anthill

The Anthill tenements, 55kms north west of Kalgoorlie, lie immediately west of the Zuleika Shear Zone which hosts a number of major gold deposits including Blue Funnel, Kundana and Raleigh. A review of the historical data showed a number of interesting results with up to 25g/t Au in some of the drill holes. We got our hands on the diamond core from previous drilling, which showed visible gold, and re-sampled it to confirm the results.

Mt. Elvire

The Mount Elvire tenement is 210km north of Southern Cross in the Southern Cross Greenstone Belt which is highly prospective for iron ore. We recently spent three days camping out on the tenement to map and sample the Banded Iron Formation (BIF) ridges that outcrop in a large portion of the tenement. The strategy was pretty simple - look for the biggest, steepest hills and this proved pretty effective.
